

The importance of speedy CAPAs: introducing the supply chain integrity team

Why speed matters

The healthcare industry operates in an environment of complex logistics and stringent regulatory requirements. Ensuring timely delivery of healthcare products is not just standard, it is a nonnegotiable necessity. For an industry that directly impacts patient health and well-being, there can be zero tolerance for error.

Corrective and Preventive
Actions (CAPAs) lie at the heart
of maintaining quality, efficiency,
and compliance. CAPAs involve
identifying the root cause of
an issue, implementing corrective measures to address the
problem, and establishing
preventive actions to avoid
recurrence.

Fast CAPA responses are essential for the following reasons:



Risk mitigation:

Swift actions prevent minor issues from escalating into major problems, thereby safeguarding the integrity of the supply chain.



Continuous improvement:

Timely CAPA responses contribute to ongoing improvements in processes and systems, reducing the likelihood of future deviations.



Customer trust:

Quick and effective resolution of issues enhances customer confidence and satisfaction, fostering long-term partnerships.



Regulatory compliance:

Adhering to industry standards and regulatory requirements demands prompt action to resolve any discrepancies.

Kuehne+Nagel's supply chain integrity team: A case study in excellence

In February 2022 after a customer escalation, it became clear to the Healthcare Logistics team at Kuehne+Nagel, that they needed to overhaul their CAPA process. A centralised, global team dedicated to consistency and fully meeting customer CAPA expectations was needed. A team that could step in and liaise with all the parties involved—from Kuehne+Nagel healthcare operations to airlines and shipping lines—and that, when a deviation occurred, could collect and analyse all the evidence about the incident: The supply chain integrity (SCI) team was born. A CSI for logistics, the SCI team conduct forensic-like investigations into shipment irregularities and enroute incidents, delving into all areas of service to get to the root cause of a deviation.





The complexity of CAPA investigations varies, with some requiring a deep analysis of temperature data-logger records, mapping the recorded data against shipping milestones, with links to the actual weather conditions during the journey, and speed of travel. By a process of elimination, the SCI team identify and address both the contributory and root cause of the problem. The team go to whatever lengths are necessary to determine when and for how long any excursions occurred and whether they were considered 'expected', 'unexpected' or 'out of service standard'.

Recently the team were confronted with solving the mystery of why the temperature data loggers on a sea shipment indicated a cyclical dipping of temperature during transit. The SCI team investigated and analysed factors such as the reefer's position and weather conditions, and after painstakingly

examining all the possible causes for the periodic fluctuation in the temperature, they consulted a university professor to understand if it were possible that humidity was affecting the temperature. On discovering that the dehumidification settings were indeed causing the air to cool, preventative actions were swiftly implemented.

The SCI team has grown from a small group of three people to a robust team managing the entire process across the business (for certain shipments). Transforming Kuehne+Nagel's CAPA reporting process, making it the industry benchmark. In 2024 alone, the SCI team completed over 1,200 investigations. They operate with a clear set of key performance indicators (KPIs), aiming to resolve issues within 20 working days in alignment with the typical response time of carriers, ensuring prompt and effective resolution of deviations.


